THE SUMMARY

Section I:

1. The rural charitable “**Project ANVESHINI**” continues as outlined in last years report.

To quote from last years report “We consider this an exceptional project where trained volunteers travel door to door in selected rural areas trying to identify new diabetics and offer assistance to existing patients. This project is carried out in several districts (Doddaballapur, Gowribidanur, Nelamangala, Devanahalli and Koratagere) in association with a very dedicated NGO (GASS – Grameena Abhyudaya Seva Samasthe). This NGO is already doing an exceptional work in many areas, including health and has good network of volunteers. We have trained about 120 volunteers in basic diabetic care including recognition of the disease, performing blood sugar, checking blood pressure and counselling of the patients



The above numbers arguably are the highest numbers of epidemiological data available in the world, especially considering these are completely free to the patients

3. **The well-equipped and staffed mobile van** visits rural areas to provide screening and care for diabetic patients, mostly for foot and vascular problems. The visits cover numerous impoverished rural areas within 150 kms. of Bengaluru. On an average the mobile unit conducts these “clinics” 22 time a month, apart from screening camps totaling 178 visits. 52483 patients were screened/evaluated in Jan 24-Dec 24.

4. Nearly the entire project, which is an off shoot of “Project Padasamrakshane” previously funded by World Diabetes Foundation, Denmark, is funded by generous contribution of Dr. Mohammad Majeed of Sami Labs, routed through Athreya Vascular Foundation, which is intimately tethered to JIVAS
5. These completely free services are rendered in partnership with Grameena Abhyudhaya Seva Samasthe (GASS), Doddaballapur
6. Mass camp in villages : Jan 24-Dec 24 in Rotary Shivmogga IDDM 120 children, 184 pairs of foot wear given for free small hand made(Rs 200x184=36800).

Most of these major limb and life saving procedures, requiring modern facilities, expensive consumables (angioplasty balloons, stents etc.). These patients are provided the same care as any other patient in the hospital without any compromise

More importantly, a third of the above funding from the donors are ploughed back in to the rural charitable projects and hence the donors are indirectly supporting these projects.

- A general ward named “JAYARANGAM” ward:** Kalkunte is a small village in Hosakote taluk, about 10 kms. from Whitefield, the present vibrant center for information technology, adjacent to Bengaluru city. In this hamlet, nay a tiny village, were born the predecessors of this Kalkunte family who wish to bequeath a ward in their memory out of love, respect, for their interminable gift of education and beyond all for instilling a sense of avowed responsibility to fellow human beings and the society as a whole. With both humility and pride, the progeny of these remarkable forerunners, Kalkunte Rangaswamy & Jayamma requested Bhagwan Mahaveer Jain Hospital, whose maxim is “Caring With Compassion” to create a ward for lower income patients to be named “JAYARANGAM WARD”.

Covid – 19 screening was started along with Diabetes foot Evaluation and Education programme, JIVAS team motivated people in the village to take vaccinations at PHC centers and Home visits by Anganawadi Staff Mass Education and awareness programmes were conducted for wearing mask , hand wash and Social distancing and compulsory Vaccination to prevent covid 19, both the doses with dates mentioned. Complete health Evaluation was planned with Local Doctors and assisted.

We go to JIVAS/WDF foot clinic in Mandya Bharatipura, Malavalli, and Melukote every month either in school premises or Govt Hospital PHC, chatra wherever it is organized. We also visit local clinics few visits to see group of patients if requested and do evaluation and education.



All the patients are given filled evaluation forms with regional language booklets, advised not to walk bare foot, they are referred to JIVAS/Bhagwan mahaveer Jain Hospital, if they have about pulses, wounds infection of foot or other vascular/ foot problems we meet referral doctors during the camp and request them to send patients to free evaluation. Background

Jain Institute of Vascular Sciences, (JIVAS) a unit of Bhagwan Mahaveer Jain Hospital (BMJH) Bengaluru has partnered with Gramina Abyuday Seva Samsthe (GASS) to reach out to those vulnerable and marginalized people living in remote villages of Karnataka who have diabetes through JIVAS diabetics care program. Over the years, we have reached out to more than 2 lakhs people in preventing and treating diabetes and its foot complications. The interventions include;

- Awareness camps using leaflets, audio visual materials and home visits.
- Survey to identify people affected with diabetes
- Screening for diabetes and treatment facilitated by Jain hospital team and
- Training of health workers for diabetic screening and follow-up.

GASS covers basically 3 districts namely,

1. Tumkur District (Korategere Taluk)
2. Chikkaballapur District (Gowribidanur Taluk) and
3. Bangalore Rural District (Doddaballapur Taluk & Devanahalli Taluk)

The intervention

During 2024, GASS has been continuing the activities in the four Anveshani Project Areas in three districts with the technical support from Jain hospital team. These interventions are special because those who attend these camps are brought from interior villages where they have not been any medical reach, including the screening for diabetes or the foot complications related to it. GASS gives special focus on the senior citizens who are usually neglected in the community.

The local health workers play a vital role in the process by informing the people about the camps and services and sending them to attend the camps. They also get orientation on the illness and the basic symptoms to identify people likely to need treatment. The health workers and the Anganwadi teachers are given training once in two months so that they are updated and interested in referring people to the services. Once trained, they also take active part in the initial screening of the patients at the village level before sending them to the camps for expert diagnosis, treatment and care.

GASS makes arrangements for the camps in Primary Health Centers, schools or on its premises in the three locations. The staff make all arrangements for the camp in advance and make sure the maximum people attend these camps every time. They are followed up by the staff on a regular basis to monitor improvements.

As part of awareness building School health programs are also conducted. It is also an occasion to screen children suspected of having diabetes and start the treatment if required at the early stages.

Key achievements

With regular camps every month in most of the locations, GASS has been able to reach out to thousands of people in a number of remote villages. Here are some data;
